
What is Teotihuacan?

- Aztec named "place where the gods were created"
- About 30 miles northeast of modern day Mexico City
- Organized using a grid plan



The Mythical Origin

- Only 5% has been scientifically excavated
- Some say Toltec culture built it
- Modern scholars believe the Totonac were more likely to have been responsible



The Sun and Moon Pyramids

- Construction of temple suggests Teotihuacan was a metropolis
- Temple of the sun is the highest pyramid in Mesoamerica
- Temple of the moon is known for its beauty





Moon Temple

UNESCO World Heritage

- Date of Inscription: 1987
- Protected by Mexican Federal Law on Monuments and Archaeological, Artistic and Historical Zones of 1972
- Authenticity preserved despite reconstruction work
